

# WRSSBA COVID-19 SAFETY PLAN

Step One: Assessing Risks at our Venues:

# 1) Places where people gather

- South Surrey Athletic Park
  - o on the baseball diamonds
  - o dugouts
  - o all entrances/exits, i.e., Gates/Bathrooms
  - o storage areas
    - Equipment Bins
    - Field Cleaning Supplies
    - Team equipment bins
    - Motorized equipment bins
  - spectator gathering areas
    - Bleachers
    - Parking lots
    - Beyond the field fence-line
  - Washroom facilities
  - Batting tunnel remains closed and should not be used.
- Bakerview Park
  - o on the baseball diamonds
  - o dugouts
  - o all entrances/exits, ie; gates/bathrooms
  - o storage areas, i.e., equipment bin and field supplies bin
  - spectator gathering areas
    - bleachers
    - parking lots
    - beyond fence-line
- Laronde Park
  - On the baseball diamonds
  - o Dugouts
  - All entrances/exits, i.e., gates/bathrooms
  - Storage areas, i.e., equipment bin and field supplies bin
  - Spectator gathering areas; Bleachers, beyond fence-lines, parking lot
- Centennial Park/Diamond
  - o On the baseball diamonds

- o Dugouts
- o All entrances/exits, i.e., gates/bathrooms
- Storage areas, i.e., yellow equipment bin, green field supplies bin
- Spectator gathering areas
  - Bleachers, beyond fence-lines, parking lot
- o Centennial Batting Tunnel should remain closed and not used for activities

#### 2) Processes and situations where people are close to one another

- On a baseball diamond
  - Participating in baseball activities as a player or coach
  - Prepping or maintaining a baseball diamond using field equipment
- Dugouts
  - Are to remain CLOSED to avoid close contact
- Entrances/exits, ie; gates/bathrooms
  - When entering or exiting any field, washroom, storage bin, or room
- Bleachers/Fence-lines/Any viewing location
  - Spectators are to follow social distancing rules for all locations outside of the diamond while viewing baseball activities
- Washroom Facilities
  - Entering/exiting, using any washroom facilities
- Storage Areas
  - When accessing any field equipment, gear, maintenance, etc
  - Maximum of 1 person in each storage bin at a time

#### 3) Equipment shared between individuals

- Equipment for baseball activities
  - o Baseballs
  - o Bases
  - Bats (players recommended to have their own)
  - Helmets (each player to provide their own)
  - o Screens
  - Pitching machines or any other baseball-machinery
  - o Hitting tee's, or other baseball-specific items
- Field Equipment
  - o Rakes
  - Drag screens
  - Gator (motorized one person at a time in use)
  - Tarps, and weights for tarps
  - Line marking, tools used for line markings
  - Bins, locks, and keys

#### 4) High Touch Surfaces

- Outdoor
  - Fences, gates, doors, etc.
  - Bases, base-plugs, and base-stand
  - All dugout area, ie; bench, fence, entrances, roof, etc. CLOSED.
  - o Bleachers
  - Equipment Bins and Locks/Keys
  - Motorized Equipment
- Indoor
  - Washroom facilities, ie; doors, sinks, counters, towel-dispenser, etc.
  - Clubhouse, including all tables, chairs, counters, etc. CLOSED.
  - Batting Cages, ie; nets, doors, screens, railings, etc. CLOSED.

# Step Two: Protocols to Reduce Risk

#### 1) Documentation Review

- Municipality Guidelines
  - Follow current ViaSport and Baseball BC to keep field permits valid.

# 2) First-Level Protection

- Occupancy limits have been established at the following locations;
  - Washrooms Max 2 people per washroom
  - Centennial Batting Tunnel Max 4 people per side (CLOSED)
  - WRSSBA Indoor Facility Max 12 people (CLOSED)
  - Dugouts (ALL PARKS) Max 12 people (CLOSED)
  - Concession Max 2 people (CLOSED)
- Measures to keep people social distancing
  - Communication delivered to all coaches, players, parents, and volunteers
  - o Signage posted at all entrances/exits, parks to social distance
  - Closed most facilities/indoor venues per Baseball BC guidelines

#### 3) Second-Level Protection

- Barriers/Partitions
  - Plexiglass for concession protection future opening
  - o Participants only allowed inside training facility
  - Executive meetings moved to on-line conferencing

#### 4) Third-Level Protection

- Administrative Rules
  - Limiting the number of players, and coaches, at each baseball event
    - Baseball BC guidelines will be followed as they are revised
  - Limiting the number of spectators, parents, and volunteers at each event
    - Baseball BC guidelines will be followed at they are revised
    - Bleachers are closed. Spectators are to socially distance.
      - Parents to sit in own chair outside fence line
      - No gathering near gates, or in parking lots.
  - Baseball BC Return to Play Guidelines for spectators also in R2P.

#### 5) Reduce Risks of Surface Transmission

- Handwashing stations
  - South Surrey Athletic Park washroom
  - Centennial Park washroom
  - Laronde disinfectant has been provided to coaches/supply bin
  - Bakerview Park disinfectant has been supplied to coaches/supply bin
- Proper Hygiene Communication
  - Sanitizer and disinfectant provided to coaches and umpires
  - o Coaches have been detailed a list of requirements pre and post-practice
  - Coaches were communicated via meetings/phone calls of importance.

# 6) Cleaning Protocols

- Equipment sanitized as per <u>Baseball BC</u> and <u>ViaSport</u>
- Sanitizer and disinfectant provided to coaches via supply bins
- 'Cleaning Buckets' have been organized and put at each field equipment bin
- City cleans washrooms and stocks sanitation on the daily
