	 Tarps for Centennial/Laronde → the current tarps at Centennial 	
	& Laronde are needing replacement. Group discussed the fact	
	that theft has been a concern in the past and that the tarps can	

be purchased but not to purchase a very expensive tarp in case they are stolen.

- Chalk or move to paint → Discussion posed as to whether we should make a switch to paint. Paint is more expensive, there is a lot of waste, and it does not stick as well to the dirt. Our supplier has reached out indicating that there is a new product available that we could try. We have to consider the waste, i.e. cans, and how/where we will dispose of them. If we stay with chalk, we should consider a better dispenser.
- Plan for keys FY26 → there have been numerous calls through the past year where the lock box was left empty, as someone has taken the key home. The green lock is City of Surrey and the silver locks are WRSSBA. Explored ideas, including: giving a key with each equipment bag, putting an extendable string on the key in the lock box, changing the code to the lock box annually, having an emergency back up that a code is given by the executive member when the call for access is received, and discussed things that had been tried in the past. There are barriers to having the key attached in the lock box, as one location cannot service all the locks at the park.
- Equipment to consider for budget → tarps, distance plates on the outfield, rebuilding mounds and warm up pens at Centennial, folding L-screen for Laronde, slingers for 8U (2 SSAP, 2 Bakerview) may need some repair/replacement, PeeWee SSAP mound needs re-building

13U AA Teams and Tiering

- Having two teams is a year-to-year decision. Group discussed whether the 2013/2014 pairing should pursue the same approach. The experience of 13U A spring and summer was discussed and it does not seem as though there were too many complaints.
- Our registration numbers are attached to field availability (149 registrants max) so we will go ahead with one AAA, two x AA teams, and then house spring with 1 x 13U A summer
- After a thorough group discussion, we decided that we will not tier the 13U A spring as long as we are running two AA teams.
 We will also continue to think about ideas for how we could supplement the 'in-between' players

13U AAA Paid Coaching

 Put to the group for discussion: points discussed included the rationale behind the decision, the cost impact for players with hired coaches, the need/benefit of having paid coaches, the potential impact on the culture of the association

Rep Team Evaluation Methodology and Process
